1 Mass import of preview images for existing items

In the latest version of the pCon.catalog Editor, we are introducing a new mass operation that allows you to import preview images at the same time. For models, you can now create and insert preview images from the available CAD files. Furthermore, it will be possible to import preview images from your desktop for several existing models and materials.



Figure 1 - Mass operation for importing preview images




Figure 2 - Dialog window for importing preview images

2 Creating a customized catalog structure

This feature can be used to create individual folders and assign the available models and materials. The catalog structure is then displayed within a brand in pCon.catalog.




Figure 3 - creating catalog structure




Figure 4 - Catalog structure in the pCon.catalog
