# 1 Transfer of material information to other pCon applications

With the latest release, material information stored in the *pCon.catalog Editor* is now automatically transferred to other pCon applications. This ensures that all applications can consistently track which materials are used in a design.

The following information is transferred:

- Manufacturer name
- Material title
- Categories
- Descriptive texts
- Product properties




Figure 1 - Material information in the pCon.catalog Editor

The material information is displayed in the following pCon applications at the moment:

- pCon.planner 8
- pCon.planner web
- Impress






Figure 2-Display of material information using the example of pCon.planner



### 2 Multiple categorization of models and materials

With the new multiple categorization feature, models and materials in the pCon.catalog Editor can now be assigned to up to 5 categories at the same time. This allows content to be structured and presented more flexibly—without having to create multiple data sets.

This allows complex product portfolios to be displayed more clearly and expanded dynamically. Users of pCon.catalog can find relevant content faster, as products are displayed in all relevant categories.

In the model and material overview, the various selected categories are now displayed with icons in the "Categories" table column. When you hover your mouse over an icon, the category name is displayed.

Uncategorized models/materials are displayed in the table column with a "?".




Figure 3 - "Categories" table column in the pCon.catalog Editor



Depending on which categories have been selected in a model/material, different product properties can be stored, which are then displayed in pCon.catalog.




Figure 4 - Category properties

#### **Example for multiple categorization**

A chair model can appear in both the "Office Chairs" and "Work Chairs" categories. Once a subcategory has been selected, it is no longer possible to select the main category "Chairs." If five categories have been selected, no additional categories can be selected.




Figure 5 - Multiple categorization of models in pCon.catalog






Figure 6 - Maximum number of categories in the pCon.catalog Editor
